From the Pastor ...

November. Thanksgiving.

They sort of go together, don't they? Like turkey and gravy. Like stuffing and ... well ... everything (because really, we all know that stuffing is the whole point and goes with *everything*, *right*?)

Lots of things focus on thankfulness this time of year – décor, cookies and other goodies, magazine articles and blog posts galore, even all sorts of apparel. There are a few hashtags that float around social media throughout November – "thankfulness a day" challenges that encourage people to name one thing they're thankful for every day throughout the month.

And truly, thankfulness is a beautiful thing. Yet sometimes, in the midst of hard and stressful times, it can be admittedly hard to find that wide open, lighthearted thankful headspace. That doesn't mean those moments and people and experiences and blessings that we're thankful for aren't there. I just means we might have trouble recognizing them through the fog of our own exhaustion, fear, anxiety, or grief.

But what about gratitude? Is there a difference between thankfulness and gratitude?

I think there is. There is a depth and a breadth to gratitude. There are layers of meaning and experience wrapped up in gratitude – layers that can be both pleasant and painful, wonderful and wearying. You can express gratitude from a place of difficulty and distress. In a blog post for Psychiatric Medical Care, Susan Rhoades writes, "We may feel thankful for [people, things, or experiences in our lives]. However, gratitude goes much deeper than this. It is a state of being, where you feel a sense of appreciation that comes from deep within."

And in this particular time and place that we're all inhabiting right now, so, so many of us are struggling with things – COVID, mental health, grief and loss, illness, conflict, and so much more. The nonchalance of thankfulness may feel out of reach right now, and that's okay. You're in good company. Hear the words of the psalmist:

I cry out to you, Lord.
You are my rock; don't refuse to hear me.
I'll be just like those
going down to the pit.
Listen to my request for mercy
when I cry out to you,
when I lift up my hands
to your holy inner sanctuary. ...
Bless the Lord
because he has listened
to my request for mercy!

The Lord is my strength and my shield.

My heart trusts him.

I was helped, my heart rejoiced,
and I thank him with my song.

~ Psalm 28:1-2, 6-7.

It cannot be denied that there's a power in gratitude. On its page dedicated to gratitude, 7 Summit Pathways lists out some of the benefits of gratitude in our lives. 7 Summit Pathways is an addiction treatment center in Florida – certainly a place and an experience that understands excavating the power of gratitude even from the dark and difficult places, from rock bottom. Gratitude helps create healthy habits. It increases resiliency and empathy. It opens the door to more relationships, and it enhances mental strength and self-esteem. Throughout the rest of Psalm 28, the psalmist makes it clear that things are hard – that s/he has been through some tough times. Actually, with the present tense used in that very first line, the psalmist is still going through those tough times. And yet, the psalmist finds a center of gratitude in the midst of that storm ... and that center is God. The God who loves us. The God who keeps us. The God who hunkers down in the midst of the tough stuff with us so that we are never truly alone.

So in the name of gratitude – finding it, clinging to it, inhabiting it – I want to leave you this month with some questions to encourage you to explore gratitude with some questions from 7 Summit Pathways:

- What aspects of your city or neighborhood are you grateful for?
- What have others done in your life that you're grateful for?
- Who is someone that really listens when you talk, and how does that affect you?
- What's a stressor you're grateful to have put behind you this year?
- How many of your basic needs do you not have to worry about meeting today?
- What's the best thing about your home, and have you taken the time to enjoy it recently?
- Have you had a chance to help someone recently, and how did that make you feel?
- What's something you look forward to in the future?
- What's something enjoyable you get to experience every day that you've come to take for granted?
- What's a hard lesson that you were grateful to learn?
- What about today has been better than yesterday?
- What's an aspect of your physical health that you feel grateful for?
- What happened today/yesterday/this week/this month/this year that you're grateful for?
- What's an aspect of your personality that you're grateful for?
- How have you used your talents recently, and what have you enjoyed about doing that?
- What relationships are you grateful for?
- What's one thoughtful thing someone did for you recently?
- What's an aspect of how you were parented for which you feel grateful?
- What's one thing you've enjoyed about doing your job recently?
- What made you laugh or smile today?

Current Worship Requirements


It is such a joy to be back together for worship!! I love not being the only one in the building on Sunday mornings!

Click the checkbox, then click the "Start shopping" button. Anytime that you shop with Amazon after that, you need to do so by going to http://smile.amazon.com, not the regular Amazon homepage.
- 2) Go to the Amazon homepage and type "Amazon Smile" into the search bar. If you've already got a charity that you've been donating a portion of your Amazon purchases to and would like to switch to the church, simply click on the "Change my organization" link. If not, search for "Presbyterian Church of Oronoco" and select us as your designated organization.

Advent 2021: Salvation Comes...

As we journey through the season of Advent together this year, we'll do so with different Scriptures that give voice and vision to the coming Savior. We'll begin with the words of three different prophets who foretold the coming of God's salvation – the prophet Jeremiah, the prophet Ezekiel, and the prophet Isaiah. And just before we celebrate the birth of the Christ-child on Christmas Eve, we'll move to the prophetic words that begin the gospel of John. We'll spend the season contemplating the ways in which salvation comes:

- November 28 Jeremiah 29:1, 4-14: Salvation Comes in the Waiting
- December 5 Ezekiel 37:1-14: Salvation Comes in Breath
- December 12 Isaiah 55:1-13: Salvation Comes in Abundance
- December 19 John 1:1-18: Salvation Comes in the Word

It's a great opportunity for anyone who can't join us and contribute an offering on a regular basis. It's also a great opportunity for guests, whether they're here for a Sunday morning service or a special service like a wedding or funeral.

Christmas Cookie Sale

Date: Saturday, December 4 Time: 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

Cost: \$7 per pound

We've had so many people asking about our Christmas cookie sale again – asking Pastor Lisa, asking through Facebook, calling the church, and asking various congregation members. After much



discussion with both the Session and the congregation after worship, we've decided that we can hold our Christmas cookie sale again this year but with a few alterations to procedure.

- 1. All boxes will be prepackaged by church volunteers wearing masks and gloves. There will be 2 different weights: 1 lb. and 2 lbs.
- 2. All boxes will include the same kinds of cookies. To ensure that, we're going to ask everyone who wants to contribute cookies to bake 20 dozen of one kind of cookie instead of all sorts of different kinds. We'll also have a sign-up to be sure we don't end up with multiple people contributing sugar cookies or gingerbread cookies (so if you want to contribute one of those, sign up early!)
- 3. Everyone coming to pick up a box of cookies will sign up beforehand using a Google form (in progress). On the form, people will let us know what size box they'd like (and whether they'd like more than one box), whether they want a nut-free box, what time they'll be picking up their box in 15-min. slots, and who will be picking it up. We'll be able to limit the responses to 10 people per 15-min. slot so we don't have crazy traffic back-ups on Minnesota Ave. .

We'll label the boxes:

- a. By the name of who's picking it up
- b. By weight
- c. With a list of the cookies in the box
- d. If it's a nut-free box

As always, we make sure everyone knows that our cookies are all baked in private homes, so we cannot guarantee no cross-contamination for nut allergies.

Also, we are considering a "drop in" time to come pick up cookie boxes at the end – perhaps the last 30 mins. – for anyone that didn't or couldn't sign up using the Google form. For that drop-in time, it would be first come, first serve. When the cookie boxes are gone, they're gone.

On December 3, we will also need at least **6 people** to pack and label the boxes. And on December 4, we'll need at least **6 people** to help distribute the boxes and make change. There are 2 sign-up sheets on the bulletin board at church – one for the cookies (please write what kind of cookie you're planning on making/bringing so we don't double up) and one for those coming to work either on Friday or Saturday (or both!)

We've got full-sized fliers as well as ¼-sheet mini-fliers that need to be distributed around the area. We've also got a Facebook event (search for "Oronoco Christmas Cookie Sale") that you can share on your own Facebook pages. Help us get the word out!
