



The Pastor's Page

Well ... the baby Jesus has been born.

Hurray! Rejoice! We've sung with the angels. We've knelt with the shepherds. We've sought out the Christ-child with the magi.

But ... now what?

At our house, the Christmas decorations are even now making their way back into the red-and-green plastic totes that store our holiday stuff. The garbage bin is full of the used wrapping paper and bows, and the Christmas tree that fit so perfectly in our living room now resides on the curb, waiting for the wonderful city workers to come and haul it away. The new toys are put away on the shelves, and the new clothes have been washed and put away in closets and drawers. Holiday vacations are over, and we're back at work. It feels like life is starting to return to "normal" after all the hustle and bustle of the Christmas season.

But where does that leave our faith? We've boxed up our little baby Jesus figurines with the rest of the nativity sets, but what about the Christ-child who made such a powerful and poignant entrance into our lives just a few days ago? What do we do with that Christ-child now that Christmas is over?

We could take the approach of the shepherds. Luke tells us that after they found Mary, Joseph, and Jesus, they returned to their sheep in the fields, "glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them" (Lk 2:20). After their Christmas encounter, the shepherds went back to their "normal" lives, but at the same time, their lives were anything but normal. They left that stable ... they left Bethlehem ... they returned to the setting that was familiar to them, but they went with God's Word in their hearts and on their lips. They shared that Word with anyone and everyone even as they went about the routines that were already so well-known to them. Like the shepherds, we can go away from this

year's encounter with the Christ-child with God's Word on our lips, sharing that Word of love and peace and fulfillment with all those we encounter in the midst of our everyday routines.

Then again, we could take the approach of the magi. These advisors were sent to find Jesus at the behest of King Herod and were tasked with bringing news of this foretold baby back to Herod - his whereabouts and any other pertinent information that would help Herod do away with this child because Herod feared Jesus was a threat to his earthly power. The magi followed that bright, shining star to Bethlehem, and when it finally stopped over the stable, Matthew tells us the magi "were overwhelmed with joy ... and they knelt down and paid [Jesus] homage" (Mt 2:10-11). But when they finally turned their faces toward home again, the magi took a different route because they had been warned in a dream about Herod's wrath. Their encounter with the Christ-child changed their mission. It changed their path. They went in search of Jesus for one reason but ended up finding a whole new Way. And sometimes our own encounters with Jesus do this, too. We seek out Jesus for one reason or another, but in both the seeking and the finding, we discover a whole new Way, a whole new Truth, a whole new Life.

Or we could always take Mary's approach. We could gather up all the happenings of the season – the feelings, the encounters, the memories (good and bad, new and old) – and treasure them deep within ourselves. We could continue to turn them over and over in our heads and our hearts, examining them for meaning, purpose, and that unexpected glimpse of the Holy. We could let God work on us from the inside out, opening doors within us and shining the Light of the World on those dark places where we have need.

Our book selection for January is "Conversations with Myself" by Nelson Mandela. A recent review has this to say:

"The South African statesman and former political prisoner bares his mind and soul in this inspiring collection of writings and interviews. Culled from Mandela's letters, notebooks, taped conversations, prison

diaries, calendars, and an unfinished autobiography, the material includes reminiscences of the antiapartheid movement, lessons in revolutionary theory gleaned from his guerrilla training, vignettes of prison life, seething protests to authorities, tender missives to loved ones, canny political strategizing and quiet philosophical reflections. The entries recall moments of high drama, days of dreary routine and interludes of random strangeness, including a prison screening of Revenge of the Nerds. Mandela registers his anger at the humiliations and hardships imposed on him by apartheid, and his anguish over his long separation from his family (officials even denied his requests to attend his mother's and son's funerals). But what comes through most strongly is his steadfast resolve--"the knowledge that in your day you did your duty and lived up to the expectations of your fellow man is in itself a reward"--and a shrewd, ebullient humanity that finds and embraces the good even in his prison guards. The result is a moving account of Mandela's struggle and a testament to his triumph."


